+ Governance

The governance structure under the Child Cancer Research Foundation (CCRF) initiative for the Back on Track Education Program can be outlined as follows:

- 01** **Board of Management (BoM):** The governing body overseeing the strategic direction and overall operations of the Back on Track Education Program.
- 02** **Executive Committee:** A subset of the Board of Management, the Executive Committee is entrusted with implementing the decisions made by the BoM. It comprises high-level executives and experts with specific responsibilities related to the program’s day-to-day management.
- 03** **Advisory Council:** Comprised of distinguished professionals from diverse fields, the Advisory Council provides valuable insights, guidance, and expertise to ensure that the program’s activities align with best practices and remain relevant to the needs of childhood cancer survivors.
- 04** **Program Director:** This role is responsible for the overall management and coordination of the Back on Track Education Program. The Program Director works closely with the Board of Management and the Executive Committee to effectively implement the program’s vision and mission.
- 05** **Administrative Staff:** These individuals handle the administrative and logistical aspects of the program, ensuring smooth operations and efficient delivery of educational support services to childhood cancer survivors. They work closely with the Program Director and report to the Executive Committee.
- 06** **Educational Support Team:** Comprising educators, tutors, and specialists in child development, this team provides tailored educational support to children participating in the program. They work directly with the children and their families, tailoring educational resources and assistance to meet each child’s specific needs.

+ What We Do

A first of its kind in WA, the Back on Track program ensures children who go through cancer treatment and their siblings do not fall through the cracks with their education due to the enormous strain treatment can have on the entire family.

+ How We Help

The Back on Track WA team works with primary and high school students referred from Perth Children's Hospital Paediatric Oncology, Survivorship Teams, the School of Special Educational Needs: Medical and Mental Health, and several childhood cancer related charities and support groups.

Regardless of where they live, the Back on Track WA program provides the following services to children who have been diagnosed with and treated for cancer and their siblings:

- educational advocacy support during treatment if required;
- communication with the enrolling school and SSEN:MMH;
- mentoring, tutoring, social and emotional learning;
- in partnership with online education providers, such as 3P Learning and IG3 Education solutions, curriculum support for students in K-10;
- support for teachers/class members when the child is ready to return to school.
- support for siblings and parents;
- work with other childhood cancer agencies to create long-term solutions to any educational need for a Back on Track student tailoring individual support.

The heart of "Back on Track" lies in its unique and holistic approach.

When a specialised education advocate is enlisted, they become a steadfast companion to the family at any stage of the child's cancer journey. Their overarching objectives include assisting the family in leveraging the resources of SSENH: MMH school during treatment and collaborating with the education team to offer supplementary support post-treatment. This comprehensive and personalised support doesn't solely focus on the students; it extends its reach to parents, classmates, and teachers. The aim is to construct a robust support system tailored to the unique needs of the family, seamlessly reintegrating them into the classroom environment.

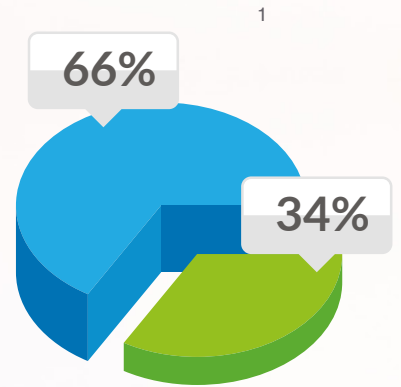

+ Why the Back on Track Program is needed

The need for the Back on Track program is supported by evidence derived from extensive research, consultations with families, children who have undergone cancer treatment, adults who had cancer as children, and support organisations:

Educational Challenges and Physical Health

- The intersection of physical health challenges and educational gaps presents a unique obstacle for these children, as they must contend with the academic catch-up and the physical limitations that affect their ability to participate in educational activities fully.
- Limited awareness and understanding of the specific educational needs of children with cancer within the education system contribute to a lack of targeted support. It is crucial to address these gaps and provide specialised assistance for these students during and after their treatment.

Psychosocial Impact

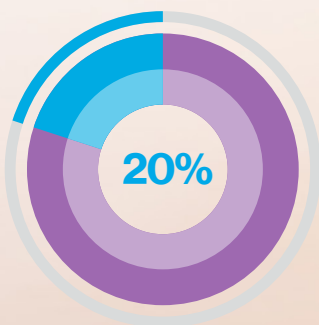
- A substantial proportion of children and adolescents undergoing cancer treatment are at risk of experiencing post-traumatic stress symptoms, which can significantly impact their emotional well-being and ability to engage in learning fully.
- Disrupted sleep patterns and poor sleep quality, often experienced by children during and after cancer treatment, can lead to increased fatigue, impaired concentration, and reduced cognitive functioning, contributing to additional barriers to learning and academic success.

Impact on Physical Health

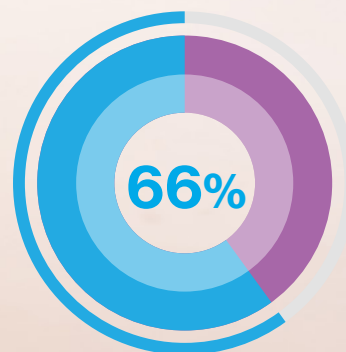
- Children undergoing cancer treatment experience a range of physical health challenges, including fatigue, compromised immune systems, and reduced physical stamina, which can hinder their ability to participate in regular school activities actively.
- Studies indicate that cancer treatments can lead to neurocognitive deficits, impacting memory, attention, and overall cognitive abilities, which can further impede their academic progress and engagement in the classroom.
- Hearing loss resulting from specific cancer treatments poses a significant challenge, affecting communication, social interactions, and the overall quality of the educational experience for these children.

Lack of Support

The research identified significant gaps in support services available for children undergoing cancer treatment in the education system. There was a consensus among respondents that having an advocate supporting a child’s educational needs during treatment would have significantly improved their education levels post-treatment.

+ What distinguishes Back on Track from other entities or services in children's health

Education Advocacy Focus

The program specifically advocates for children's education during and after cancer treatment. It recognises the critical role of education in a child's development and works to bridge the gap and support their educational journey.

Tailored Support

Back on Track provides personalised educational support to children based on their individual needs. It offers mentoring, tutoring, and curriculum support, ensuring the assistance is tailored to each child's specific requirements.

Collaboration and Partnerships

The program actively collaborates with schools, online education providers, charities, support groups, and medical teams. This collaborative approach ensures a holistic and coordinated support system for the children, involving various stakeholders in their education and well-being.

Technological Solutions

Back on Track leverages technology and online education platforms to reach children in remote and regional areas. This enables them to receive educational support regardless of their geographical location, addressing the unique challenges faced by Indigenous children and those in remote areas of Western Australia.

These unique characteristics make the Back on Track program essential in addressing the educational needs of children who have survived cancer.

By focusing on education advocacy, providing tailored support, collaborating with stakeholders, and utilising technology, the program offers a comprehensive and distinct approach to supporting these children's health and educational outcomes.



+ Areas we service



The Back on Track program assumes a critical role in supporting children who have undergone cancer treatments in rural, regional, and remote areas, as exemplified by our teachers' visits across Western Australia. Our dedicated teachers have personally visited families in the Perth Metropolitan area, Peel, South West, Great Southern, Pilbara, Kimberley, Goldfields-Esperance, and Wheatbelt. These young survivors often confront unique challenges related to their health, education, and overall well-being. By extending its services to these distant communities, the program addresses the immediate needs of these resilient children and plays a vital role in fostering their educational and personal development.

The outreach initiative ensures that these young survivors and their families receive the necessary resources and assistance to successfully navigate the post-treatment education phase. In doing so, Back on Track contributes significantly to promoting inclusivity, empowering these children to overcome hurdles, access quality education, and thrive despite the geographical constraints they may face.

In 2024, Back on Track is poised to expand its impact further, exemplifying its unwavering dedication to reaching every corner of the state. The program will extend its services and reach into the West and East Kimberley region, marking a significant step in ensuring that all children, regardless of their location, can rebuild their lives and futures after battling cancer. This expansion underscores the program's commitment to inclusivity and its mission to support young survivors and their families in even the most remote areas of Western Australia. OUR IMPACT

In the realm of childhood cancer, the courage of young children shines through as they confront the unfathomable challenges of the disease and its aftermath.



In Australia alone, every year witnesses the valiant struggle of countless children, with childhood cancer remaining the leading cause of death among children aged 1-14 (Cancer Council Australia).

For those who survive, the journey doesn't end with remission, as over 60% of survivors grapple with chronic health issues post-treatment (Children's Cancer Institute).

In this battle for normalcy and restoration, the Back on Track Education Program serves as a beacon of hope, illuminating the path towards academic recovery and emotional healing. Guided by tailored educational support, these resilient young people find solace in rediscovering the joys of learning, reclaiming their stolen childhoods, and rekindling the flicker of dreams that cancer tried to extinguish. With each success story, we witness the transformative power of compassion and perseverance, nurturing a generation of survivors who refuse to be defined by their hardships but instead choose to author their own tale of triumph and resilience.

The Back on Track program directly impacts the lives of disadvantaged, sick, and vulnerable children by providing them with crucial educational support during and after their cancer treatment.

The expected short and long-term outcomes of the program are outlined in the pages that follow.

PROVIDING CRUCIAL EDUCATIONAL SUPPORT BEFORE & AFTER TREATMENT.



+ Short Term Impacts

Improved Educational Continuity

The program aims to ensure that children in treatment do not fall behind in their education. The short-term outcome is providing immediate support and resources to help these children keep up with their studies and minimise learning gaps during treatment.

Enhanced Well-being

The program promotes overall well-being by addressing the educational needs of children who have survived cancer. It helps them regain a sense of normalcy, social interaction, and purpose, reducing the psychological impact of their cancer experience.

Increased Parental Confidence

The program provides parents with a support system and resources to navigate their child's educational journey during and after treatment. This increases parental confidence in advocating for their child's educational needs and maintaining a positive parent-school partnership.

+ Long Term Impacts

Improved Academic Achievement

The program's long-term outcome is to support children in reaching their educational potential despite the challenges they faced during cancer treatment. The program aims to improve these children's academic achievement in the long run by addressing learning gaps, providing mentoring, tutoring, and curriculum support.

Enhanced Social Integration

The program aims to help children successfully reintegrate into the school environment and foster positive relationships with peers and teachers. By ensuring educational continuity, the program aims to provide children with the Foundation to pursue their future goals and aspirations. The long-term outcome is to increase their opportunities for higher education, career paths, and overall life success despite their cancer experience.

+ Wide Reaching Impact

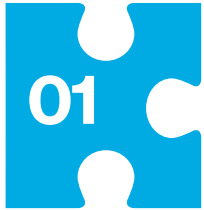

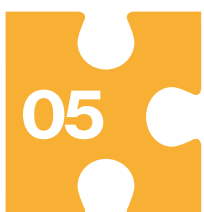
Advocacy and Awareness

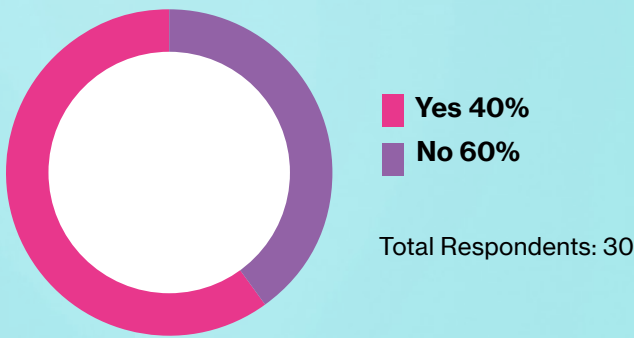

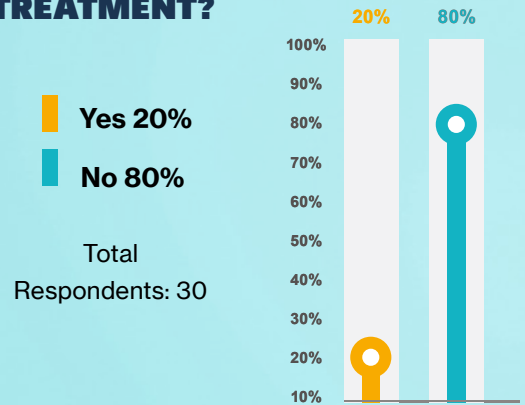
IMPACT SURVEY

Recently commissioned to help improve our education advocacy service. Answers were provided by 30 families in the WA childhood cancer community. Some are currently using the Back on Track program.

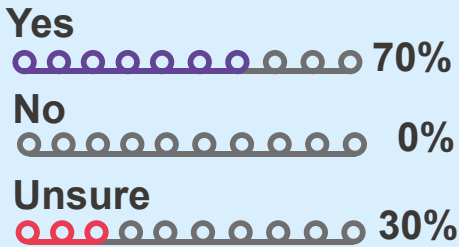
HAVE YOU ENROLLED YOUR CHILD OR CHILDREN IN THE BACK ON TRACK PROGRAM?



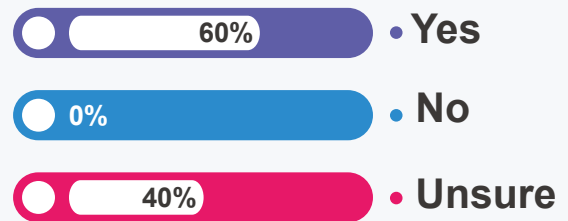
IS YOUR CHILD CURRENTLY IN TREATMENT?



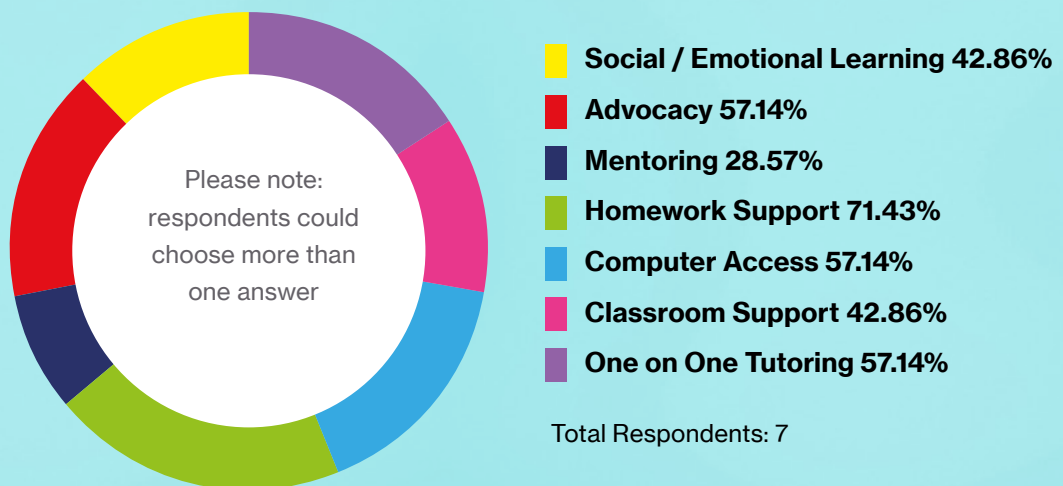

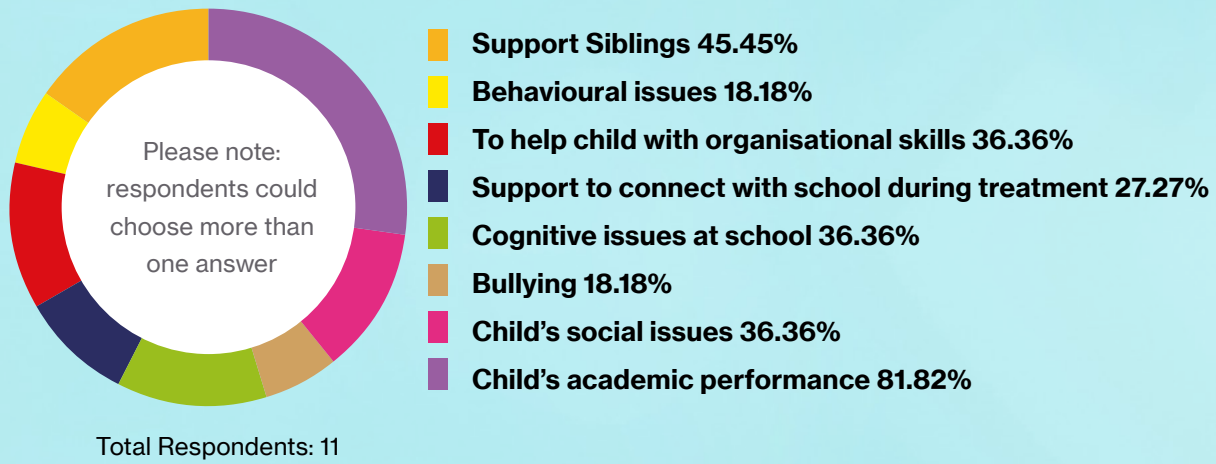

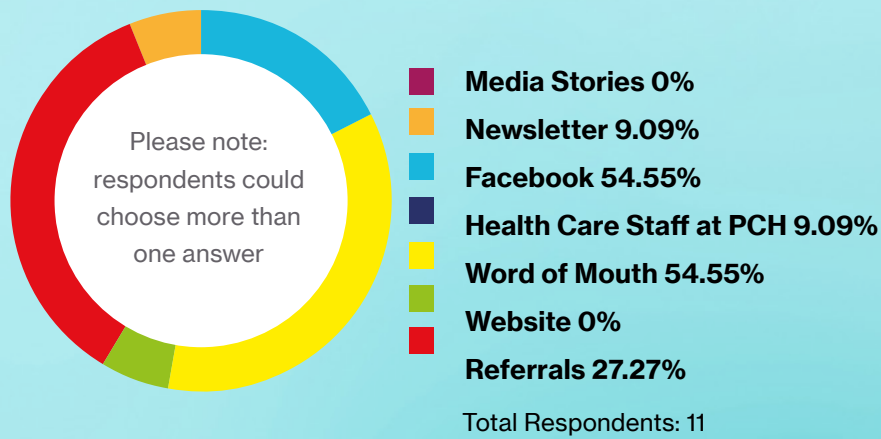
WHICH BACK ON TRACK SERVICES HAS YOUR CHILD ACCESSED?



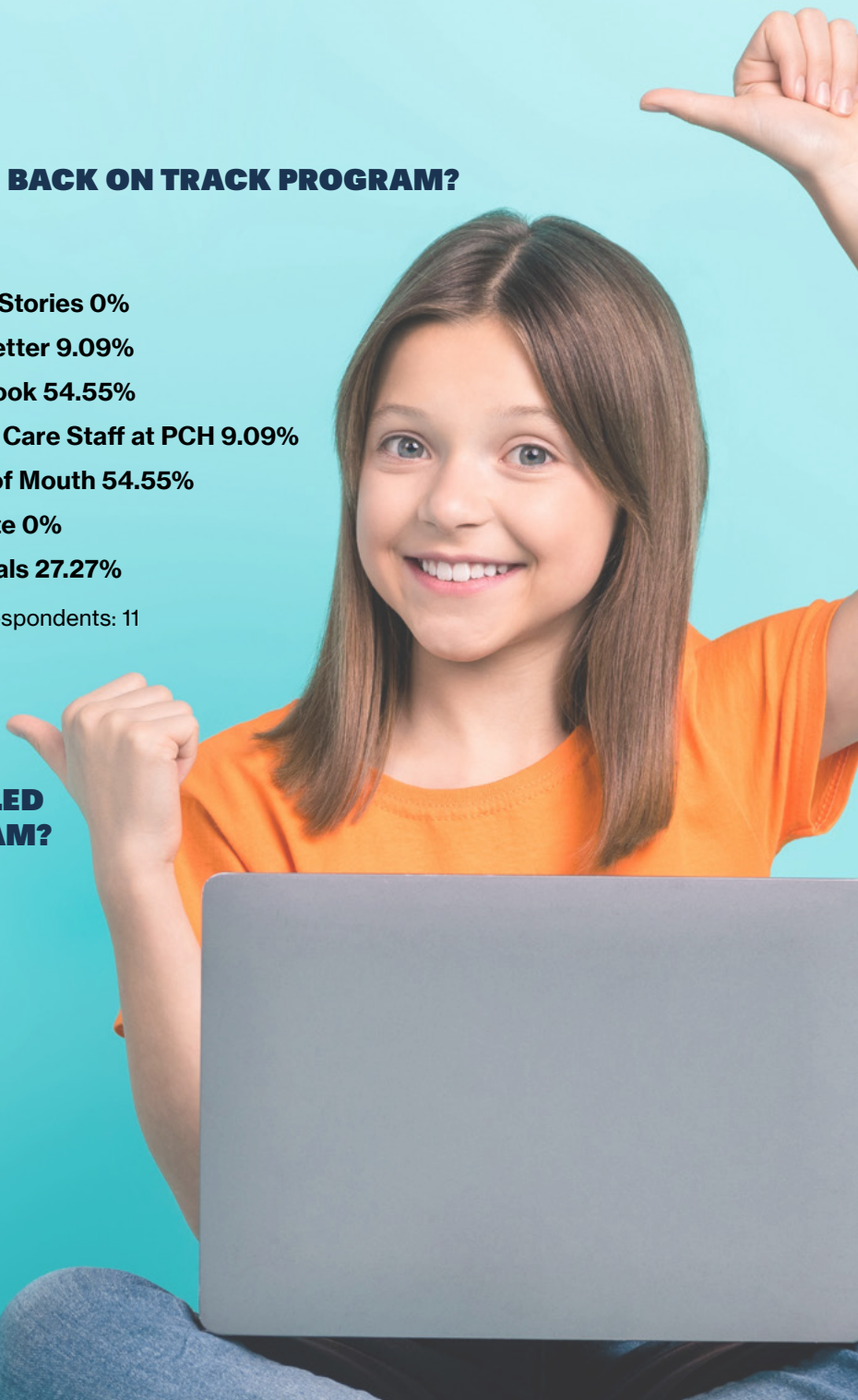
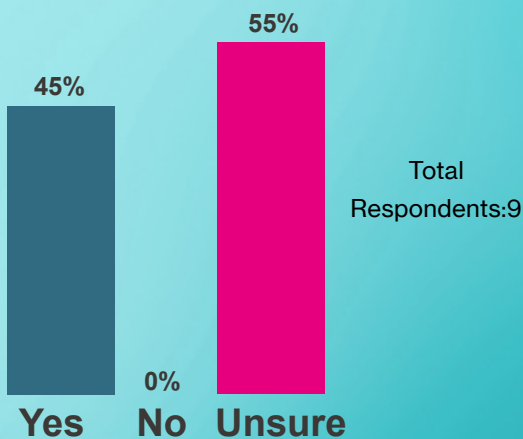

CASE STUDY #1

MARLEY

For young Marley Brown, the dream of becoming a theoretical physicist or astrophysicist is now even more possible with the support of the Back on Track program.

Diagnosed with Acute Lymphoblastic Leukaemia at 15 months old, Marley’s treatment impacted his development at kindy and well into his early primary school years. Now in year 9, Marley is armed with the resources and support he needs to feel empowered to succeed in the classroom, infinity, and beyond.

Watching her son struggle with neurocognitive side effects since primary school, mum Kerrin Hampson says she’s already seen the benefits of the program and believes the initiative will continue to help Marley find his confidence, feel supported and give him the structures he needs to succeed on his terms.

“This is the best Marley has been at school, ever. I really want to thank you and Back on Track WA. He’s always loved school, but this is completely different,” says Kerrin.

Fremantle College has proudly partnered with Back on Track WA to support Marley’s learning and achievement, which includes a STEM and engineering excursion to the East Coast in 2023. Thanks to a fully funded scholarship by the program. The Sydney Observatory, CSIRO discovery centre, and the Canberra Deep Space Centre were on the trip’s itinerary.

Marley’s thirst for science began with his interest in cancer research early on and has since evolved over time.

Gifted and Talented Coordinator at Fremantle College, Susan Fahey, says, “Marley responds to every challenge with a smile and a good sense of humour. He has set himself goals for each of his subjects with the overarching goal of improving his study skills, organisational skills, and focus.”

CHALLENGES

Marley faced several challenges, including the assumption that being in the Gifted and Talented Program meant he didn't require additional tutoring.

His coping skills, developed over years of managing the neurocognitive side effects of his childhood treatment, were already extensive. Additionally, Marley's exceptional intelligence posed its own set of challenges.



CASE STUDY

Transforming Marley's educational experience with the Back on Track Program

OVERVIEW

Marley Brown, a 14-year-old aspiring theoretical physicist or astrophysicist, has found renewed hope and support through the Back on Track WA (BOTWA) program. Despite being diagnosed with Acute Lymphoblastic Leukaemia at just 15 months old, Marley's passion for science and STEM subjects has driven him to excel academically.

Currently enrolled in the Gifted and Talented Program at Fremantle College, Marley's journey with BOTWA began later in his academic career, providing him with essential resources and support to overcome the challenges posed by his cancer treatment.

ACTION

The Senior Educational Advocate at BOTWA took a personalised approach to address Marley's specific needs. Collaborating closely with Marley's teachers and the Gifted and Talented Coordinator, the advocate focused on enhancing Marley's study habits and time management skills.

Recognising the impact of cancer treatment on Marley's executive functions, such as memory, organisation, and time management, the advocate developed tailored strategies to mitigate these challenges.





SOLUTION

To support Marley’s academic success, the advocate implemented various solutions. Scaffolding assignments, including layout and information organisation, became a crucial strategy.

Additionally, a scholarship was provided to ensure Marley could participate in an interstate STEM and Engineering Excursion, further nurturing his passion for science.

IMPACT

Beyond Marley’s personal growth, his involvement in BOTWA had a broader impact. It not only supported his older brother but also served as an inspiration for other children facing academic obstacles due to cancer treatment. Marley’s story highlighted the availability of additional support, instilling hope in families navigating similar challenges.



RESULTS

Through the collaborative efforts of Marley, BOTWA, and his educational support team, Marley’s academic journey saw remarkable improvements. His story serves as a testament to the program’s efficacy and its potential to positively impact the lives of children overcoming academic obstacles post-cancer treatment.

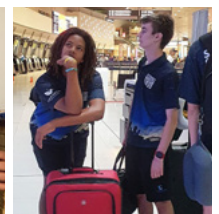
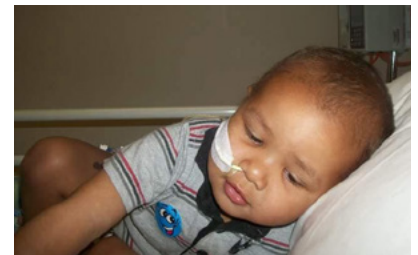
BENEFITS

CASE STUDY #2

NOVA

Nova was diagnosed with Lymphoblastic Leukemia in March 2022 whilst only in Pre-Primary. Nova is still undergoing her treatment but is attending her Year One class at school as much as possible. She is looking to 'Ring The Bell' in May 2024.

Nova has missed out on many school days, impacting her academically and socially. Missing out on time with her friends at Playtimes has significantly impacted Nova, and she has felt the loss keenly. Academically, she has lost pace with her peers and has struggled to keep up, or catch up with her classmates.

Back On Track was suggested to Nova's mum Claire earlier this year, and she felt lucky to get in-school support for Nova. Louise, Back on Track Program Manager and Educational Advocate, has been supporting Nova once a week.

"Having Louise there to work with Nova has made a huge difference and given Nova more confidence. Nova loves meeting with Louise every week." Claire said.

Louise ensures the intervention/support is fun and engaging for Nova, incorporating great educational games and activities.

"We've definitely noticed a massive improvement in Nova's reading, and it's been great to have Louise support me when I was unsure how to help Nova progress."

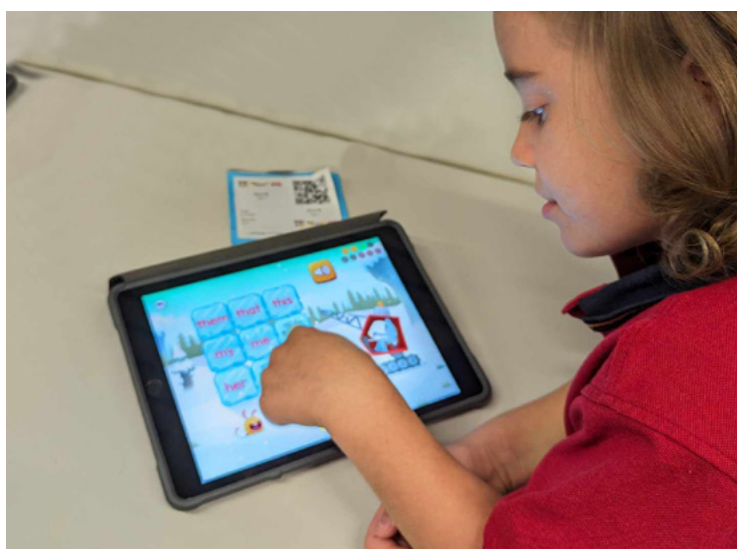

CASE STUDY

Empowering Nova's academic journey through the Back On Track WA Program

OVERVIEW

Nova, diagnosed with Lymphoblastic Leukemia in March 2022 during her Pre-Primary year, embarked on a challenging educational journey with the added burden of cancer treatment.

The impact has been profound, affecting both her social interactions and academic progress. With continued treatment, Nova is now navigating Year One, determined to achieve the 'Ring the Bell' milestone in May 2024. However, the journey has been marked by missed school days, social challenges, and academic struggles.

ACTION

To address these challenges, the Back On Track WA program intervened during Term 3, 2023, providing weekly, in-school tutoring and support:

- ☑ Increased tutoring during school hours, including support within class and independent work with her Advocate.
- ☑ Collaborated with Nova's mother to provide additional resources for home-based learning.
- ☑ Ongoing communication with the school for a smooth transition into Year 2.





IMPACT

Nova's participation in the BOTWA program has resulted in measurable progress:

- ☑ Enhanced phonics knowledge, transitioning from single sounds to digraphs and trigraphs, showcasing improved phonemic awareness.
- ☑ Increased reading proficiency, fostering a heightened eagerness to learn.
- ☑ Demonstrated progress in numerical understanding, contributing to confident participation in class activities.

RESULTS

The tangible outcomes of Nova's involvement with BOTWA are evident:

- ☑ Improved sound-letter connection, reflected in spelling tests and in-class assessments
- ☑ Greater attendance leading to increased peer interactions and classroom engagement.
- ☑ Uptake in numerical understanding demonstrated through successful participation in whole-class activities.

SUMMARY

Nova's journey with the BOTWA program underscores the transformative impact of additional support on a student facing significant health challenges.

Her phonics, reading, and numerical understanding progress demonstrates the effectiveness

of consistent, tailored educational interventions. As Nova continues to benefit from ongoing support and diverse learning opportunities, her story exemplifies the potential for academic growth and increased confidence, even in the face of formidable health obstacles.

CASE STUDY #3

LIAM

At the young age of seven, Liam received a diagnosis of Burkitt's Lymphoma, an uncommon and highly aggressive form of cancer.

His medical journey began with a biopsy, which revealed that the cancer had progressed to Stage 3, with five tumours present in his abdomen. Recovering proved to be a challenging path for Liam. He faced kidney failure, requiring a period of time in the intensive care unit. Additionally, he endured a distressing five weeks without food when his bowels became obstructed, ultimately necessitating surgery.

During his battle with cancer, Liam lost six precious months of his childhood, as the hospital became his new dwelling. Unable to attend school and too ill to engage in any educational activities, he missed out on vital opportunities for learning and personal development.

Now, cancer-free Liam is ready to resume the sense of normalcy that he and his family cherished prior to his diagnosis. One essential aspect of this return to normalcy is ensuring Liam gets back on track with his academic journey.

Fortunately, Liam is part of the incredible Back on Track program, facilitated by the Child Cancer Research Foundation. Through this program, Liam and his family have access to an amazing online educator who appears on his screen each week to help him with his schooling.

Back on Track addresses a notable gap in Western Australia's support system for children undergoing cancer treatment, providing them with the opportunity to make up for lost education. A childhood cancer diagnosis not only affects the diagnosed child but also has a profound impact on the entire family. Consequently, Liam's regular tutoring sessions not only benefit him but also offer much-needed support to his siblings, Kody and Kaylee. It acknowledges that they have also experienced a significant educational setback and deserve assistance to bridge the gap.

The program has become an integral part of his life, allowing him to continue his learning journey from the comfort of his home. Liam and his family are immensely grateful to Back on Track and the Child Cancer Research Foundation for their unwavering support both during and post his cancer treatment. The program has played a vital role in helping Liam and his siblings regain their academic footing and providing them with the educational opportunities they missed out on due to cancer.



CHALLENGES

Liam encountered significant fatigue, a common challenge for cancer survivors, impacting his ability to engage in traditional tutoring methods.

After an extended period of electronic learning during his cancer treatment, he developed an aversion to online activities. Liam's academic performance, once at the top of his class, needed a unique approach to reignite his passion for learning.



CASE STUDY

Liam started with the Back on Track WA Program not long after he had returned to a 'normal' school routine. He had missed over six months of school and his world as he had known it.

OVERVIEW

Liam's educational journey with the Back on Track WA Program began as he re-entered a "normal" school routine after a six-month hiatus due to Burkitt's Lymphoma.

Having missed crucial months of school, Liam faced challenges in resuming his education and needed a tailored approach to bridge the educational gap.

ACTION

The Back on Track WA Team took proactive steps to address Liam's challenges. Before transitioning to online tutoring, Liam met his tutor face-to-face, establishing a crucial relationship.

Personal connections were reinforced with visits to his family farm and the Back on Track WA office, ensuring a blend of online and in-person interaction. Tutoring sessions prioritised engagement, confidence-building, and a varied approach to keep Liam motivated.





IMPACT

Liam's re-engagement at school and his efforts to reclaim his top position in the class showcased the program's success.

The solid relationship with his Advocate empowered Liam to communicate his needs, ensuring a balanced approach to learning. His inclusion in the program also extended benefits to his siblings, creating a ripple effect of academic support within the family.

RESULTS

The tangible results of Liam's participation in the Back on Track WA Program are impressive. He advanced to the Year 4 level on Mathematics, excelled in in-class assessments, and demonstrated sustained engagement in his learning journey.

SUMMARY

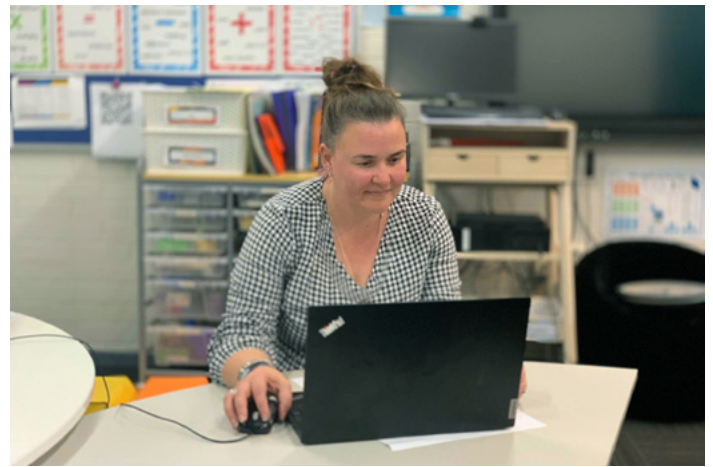

The tutoring sessions transformed to be engaging and enjoyable for Liam. Challenges and games were incorporated, turning learning into a weekly goal.

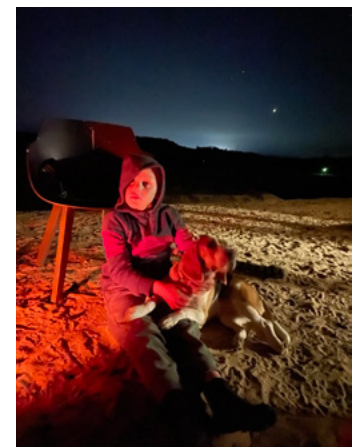

It seeks to establish sustainable frameworks that address the immediate challenges faced by young survivors and contribute to the long-term well-being of the communities involved.

By venturing into the West and East Kimberley region, Back on Track aims to break down the barriers that distance imposes on access to crucial resources and support services. This expansion represents more than just a geographical outreach; it symbolises a profound dedication to inclusivity, affirming that every child, regardless of their location, deserves the opportunity to rebuild their life and future after the harrowing experience of battling cancer.
